


1. Pressing **\*114\*** on the phone for getting the IP.

2. Enter the IP on the browser (recommend Google Chrome)

Both default username and password are admin



3. **Network Setting.** Go to network page, select Network Protocol as Static IP, then edit the IP you need. After editing, reboot to take effect.

And Enter new IP like step 2.

Network setting can also be done on the phone.

Pressing **\*115\*** for Static IP setting, according to the voice prompts, press the IP first, e.g 192\*168\*0\*67, then press # to set the gateway, e.g 192\*168\*0\*1, then press # to save.

Pressing **\*111\*** for reboot, reboot to take effect.

**5. Volume Setting.** Go to Phone Setting>Volume Setting.




**6. Hotline Setting.** This means when you pick up the handset, it will call to somewhere you set automatically.



**7. Phonebook Setting. CALL SET>Phonebook.**

The Phonebook allows you to make a call easily by pressing a number rather than an IP.

e.g Phone number is 800, URL is 192.168.0.66. It's the same call by pressing 800 or 192.168.0.66.



**8. Keyboard Function Key Setting. Phone SET>Keyboard Function**

## Key

Funckey1 is the S1 key of the phone. Funckey3 is the S2 key of the phone.

This means when you press the S1 or S2 key on the phone, it will dial to the destination you set.
